
Dear Dean:

Dear Trackowners and Sponsors:

Another racing season is at a close and it was our best yet. We qualified at a national meet for the first time at the Cator-nationals and continued to qualify at the Summernationals and the Grandnationals at Samair. We were the second low qualifier at Montreal with a 6.18 at 230 and had a first round win at 6.26 over 218 mph.

Our match race trail was also successful. We started our year at Maplegrave after the Gators and finished runner-up to Gary Burgin after we set low ET and mph at 6.39 and 218. Two races later we won another match race at Epping, New Hampshire via low ET and mph -- 6.48 at 222. Our next victory was at English-ton at their 7-11 H B 32 funny car show. We won the meet via a seed run of 6.15 at 234 mph and a wheel-standing, body-losing solo run in the finale. We had a new Corvette body installed by S&W race cars to make our next two races the following weekend. First run on the new Corvette at Connecticut Dragway netted a 6.41 at 220. Our 2nd race was the next day at Cayuga against the jet cars. We won the meet via 6.44 at 222. Our last match race was at English-ton on September 22 where we ran 6.21 at 222.

We will be campaigning a Corvette funny car for the 1979 season. We have three complete Keith Black aluminum motors and have ordered a new truck to haul our Chapparel. Our paint scheme is dynamite and a sure winner for best appearing car.



WOMBATS do not look very much like the other Australian Marsupials we have seen. In fact, except for their stumpy tails they look remarkably like a Beaver. The Wombat's body is short and stocky. Adult males can reach three feet in length and measure up to eighteen inches in height. They may weigh as much as eighty pounds.

The coloration of the short course hair and the size of the individual Wombats will be varied according to the region in which they are found.

The single Mainland species of course haired Wombat prefers the hilly coastal regions, but in recent years there has been a vast shrinkage of their range. Because of their feeding and burrowing habits they were often viewed as pest by farmers.

Wombat's teeth are rootless and grow continuously as they are worn down by his gnawing habits. The single pair of upper and lower incisors have enamel only on the outer side. Thus the soft inside wears down quicker than the outer side, and a sharp cutting edge is formed.

The Wombat's diet consists chiefly of grasses, the soft inner bark of trees, fungus, and grains. They will use their front feet to grasp and tear food.

Wombats are good diggers; using their powerful shovel shaped nails they will dig out a burrow by laying on their side and digging with the front feet they thrust the dirt out with the rear legs. They will also use their teeth to gnaw away roots that they encounter while digging.

The burrows vary in size but also include tunnels that may reach a length of fifteen feet. Wombats also dig out a shallow resting and sunning place near their burrows.

Wombats are generally solitary animals, but they may live fairly close together and sometimes their tunnel systems may inter-connect.

These generally peaceful animals are nocturnal in their native habitat and sometimes live in close proximity to man without disturbing them.

ALTHOUGH THEY DON'T APPEAR SO, W O M B A T S CAN BE VERY QUICK IN THEIR MOVEMENTS AND THEY CAN RUN RAPIDLY FOR SHORT DISTANCES. When angered, Wombats emit a hissing growl. As a means of defense Wombats use their hind legs and kick backwards.

The breeding season is from April to June. Like the Marsupials the Wombat young are born extremely underdeveloped. The female Wombat has a pouch which opens to the rear. Generally only one young is born but on rare occasions two births have been recorded. The young are carried in the pocket at least until December. Wombats in zoos have lives as long as twenty years.
